A lack of essential vitamins—that is, those vitamins which are necessary for health and normal body function—can result in serious illness. Vitamin A, for example, helps prevent the skin from becoming infected. A lack of this vitamin can lead to night blindness or can even cause mucous membranes to degenerate. A second essential vitamin is vitamin B1. Serious problems can also be created by an inadequate supply of the vitamins B6 and B12. People who don't have enough B1 sometimes contracted a disease beriberi and can be troubled by various nervous disease. When the body lacks the proper amount of B6 and B12, pernicious anemia and poor metabolism can result. Two other important vitamins are vitamin C and vitamin D. The disease scurvy can result from a deficiency of vitamin C, while a diet that deficiency in Vitamin D can lead to a condition known as rickets, a disease which makes bones so soft that they bend. A final—but by no means the final example of a disease or condition that can be brought about by a lack of essential vitamins is hemorrhaging or uncontrolled bleeding. Such bleeding can occur in people whose diets not including vitamin K.
